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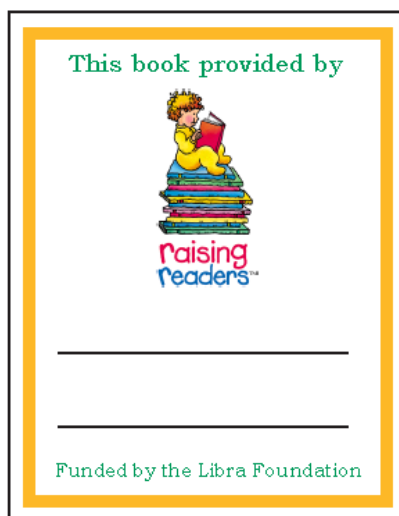
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Raising Readers Update

Stick 'em On

We often hear that we should do more to let folks know that Raising Readers supplies the books kids get from their primary care providers. So we came up with the idea of creating a bookplate that could be inserted in the books.



The neat thing about them is that there's room for you to get the credit you also deserve.

Here are some creative ideas for using the stickers:

- Use the blank lines to write in the name of the child and provider. For example: To: Susie. From: Dr. Smith.
- Simply write or stamp your practice name on the blank lines.

We suggest you place the bookplate on the inside front page. It's generally blank and most people will see the sticker when they first open the book.

For board books, you'll probably have to put the sticker on the back of the book.
