One thing warehouses have in abundance is boxes. And that's true with the warehouse we work with at Affiliated Materiel Services. They don't just ship books however; they also ship medical supplies across the state.

So what do they do with all those boxes? They re-use them! Many of our book cartons are repacked with book orders and sent back out to sites but sometimes there aren't enough book boxes and a medical supply box is used instead.

So if you're looking for a book box, look again. Your order may have been shipped to you in a medical supply box. Check the label, it'll tell you the box is from Raising Readers. Or look for the fluorescent green sticker with our logo.



Choo! Choo! New 3 Year Book



Down by the Station exposes children to a variety of interesting sounding words. Adults can model delight in the silliness of some of these words “Thrump, thrump,...Grump, grump, flip, flop” and how words represent diverse aspects of the world, including its sounds.

After a few readings children will be able to say the words along with you. Point out that some of the words—bump, grump, and thrump—have the same 3 letters—“ump”—at the end. (Source: 2009 Early Care & Education Calendar)

Point out the activities in the back of the book to parents for more fun ways to enjoy the book.
